INTRODUCTION

CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

These challenges strain democratic institutions, leading to policy paralysis, ineffective governance, and a decline in the quality of democracy. In times of crisis, governments may resort to restrictive measures, curbing civil liberties, undermining democratic norms, and hampering inclusive participation. When specific segments of society face barriers to political engagement, such as limited resources and systemic disadvantages, their voices and perspectives may be marginalized or unheard.

Addressing these challenges demands collaborative, comprehensive, and inclusive strategies that tackle the root causes of instability, inequality, and democratic deficits at local, national, and international levels. Efforts should focus on strengthening governance, promoting sustainable development, investing in democratic conflict resolution, and fostering dialogue while ensuring open pathways for information and communication to revitalize and create new narratives for the legitimacy of democratic and peace principles.

INTRODUCTION

CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

Democracy and peace are two fundamental pillars of any prosperous society. While democracy ensures that power is distributed equitably, peace creates a stable environment for progress and development. The correlation between democracy and peace is perhaps one of the most observed patterns in international relations, as it provides evidence of the empirical association that democracies tend to avoid violent conflicts. One of the prominent theories is the Theory of Democratic Peace, initially conceived by Immanuel Kant. The theory suggests that the more democratic the two regimes are, the less likely they will engage in conflict.

The importance of advancing both democracy and peace cannot be overstated. However, achieving these goals requires empowering marginalized groups and including diverse perspectives in decision-making. Women play a crucial role in advancing democracy and peace. Educated women are more politically active, engaged in civil society, and advocate for non-violent conflict resolution.

From the rubble, they rebuild. With pieces, they weave the new foundations of a community, and with effort and dedication, they begin the lengthy process that heals the wounds of conflicts. Women do groundbreaking work for democracy, peace, and security. Given the current context, urgent action is needed to ensure that women are part of democratic peacebuilding and that their contributions are visible and valued. Since the adoption of the UN Security Council Resolution 1325 in 2000, women's participation in peacebuilding has been recognized and widely defended. Yet, over the last few decades, women-led civil society organizations and leaders have not been fully included in high-level decision-making, lacking meaningful support in their participation.

The participation of women in peacebuilding activities and democratic strengthening processes cannot be treated as a box-ticking exercise or merely a means to an end. Genuine participation must include women from all parts of society, especially those frequently excluded and marginalized from mainstream formal and high-level participation spaces and mechanisms. Meaningful efforts must ensure access to these spaces by providing logistical, financial, and other resources instead of issuing passive and general invitations.

INTRODUCTION

CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

Efforts should also empower women from differing socioeconomic backgrounds, cultures, and physical capabilities to access knowledge and tools that allow them to play instrumental roles in forging and sustaining peace.

Therefore, in compliance with the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action of 1995, which has become one of the most comprehensive roadmaps towards gender equality and women's rights worldwide, including in peace and political participation, as well as UN's Resolution 1325 (2000) [S/RES/1325 (2000)] which affirms the importance of the involvement of women and the inclusion of gender perspectives in peace negotiations, humanitarian planning, peacekeeping operations, and post-conflict peacebuilding and governance.

REAL has developed an initiative to ensure the participation of women in building democratic, resilient, disarmed, and peaceful communities, the International Women Democratic Peace Alliance (IWDPA), which aims to become a convener, collaborator, advocate, and leader alliance in the global movement for women's participation in democratic strengthening and peace processes. We intend to build strong partnerships with the United Nations, governments, local women and organizations worldwide to bridge the gap between global policies and local action while promoting local voices in transnational spaces.





OBJECTIVES

PODCAST

ACTIVITY 1

This activity fosters democratic values, conflict resolution, and peacebuilding through a podcast, creating a safe space for dialogue and idea sharing. The plan includes producing 36 episodes, monthly distributed via popular social media platforms such as Spotify, YouTube, and Meta to amplify voices, inspire positive societal transformation, and promote women's leadership across Latin America.

Phase/Stage: Initial phase and throughout the entire project.

Description: Our project will feature an ongoing podcast developed internally by the implementation team in collaboration with REAL members. Through dynamic and interactive multimedia storytelling, the podcast aims to engage, inform, inspire, and empower the audience, fostering meaningful conversations and promoting project objectives.

Timeline: Q1, Q2, Q3 and Q4. The podcast will follow a regular schedule, with episodes released thrice monthly. Each episode will last one hour, allowing in-depth discussions and exploring the chosen topics.

Target Audience: To provide diverse perspectives and insights, we intend to have a guest featured in every episode. These guests will include subject matter experts, practitioners, and influential figures who can contribute valuable knowledge and experiences related to the project's themes.

PODCAST

ACTIVITY 1

Expected Outcomes:

- Audience Engagement and Informative Content: Listeners will gain valuable insights into the project's objectives, key issues, and relevant topics, fostering a deeper understanding of the subject matter.

Phase/Stage: Initial phase and throughout the entire project.

Through compelling storytelling and evidence-based research, we aim to shape a new narrative highlighting women's leadership in fostering democracy, good governance, and peacebuilding. Target Audience: The target audience for the online magazine includes individuals and organizations interested in Latin American affairs, explicitly focusing on the four targeted countries. This includes policymakers, researchers, academics, journalists, activists, and NGOs. The magazine aims to engage diverse stakeholders invested in understanding and promoting regional change.

SEMINARS

ACTIVITY 3

Facilitate dialogue and knowledge exchange among peace and democracy stakeholders through online and in-person meetings, establishing an international consortium/alliance for promoting regional peace and security. Promote intercultural dialogue, foster collaboration among diverse actors, analyze peace and security conditions, and tailor community-based peacebuilding initiatives. Empower women with resources, knowledge, and skills to reach their full potential and effectively lead community responses.

Phase/Stage: Mid-Final phase

Description: The project includes a series of online and in-person seminars, fostering dialogue and knowledge exchange among peace and democracy stakeholders. These seminars aim to establish an international consortium/alliance of organizations and individuals dedicated to promoting regional peace and security.

Topics and Formats:

- Online Seminars: Four online seminars will be delivered through Zoom and Facebook Live. Each online seminar will accommodate a maximum of 100 participants. The implementation team will lead and facilitate these online seminars, providing valuable insights and expertise.
- Concluding Seminars: The project's concluding phase will feature four online seminars, specifically centered around Honduras, Guatemala, Bolivia, and Paraguay. These seminars will serve as noteworthy milestones and mark the initial culmination of the project.
- Final seminar: Two representatives will be selected from each country to participate in the final seminar, which will be held in Washington, DC, and will serve as the platform for presenting the project's overall conclusions. In addition to presenting the final findings, the event will recognize, and award engaged women and organizations for their contributions. Our objective is to extend invitations to distinguished representatives of organizations based in Washington, D.C., with the purpose of involving them in this initiative. We seek to establish productive collaborations and forge strategic alliances that will have a beneficial influence on the region and the Americas.

Expected Speakers: Our esteemed panel of speakers comprises highly accomplished multidisciplinary members from REAL, renowned experts with extensive experience across Latin America and Europe.

SEMINARS

ACTIVITY 3

Timeline and Duration: The seminars will be conducted in Q3 and Q4. Each seminar will last one hour, except for the final seminar, which will last two hours at the pace of two days.

Target Audience: The target audience for the project's seminars includes active individuals, such as policymakers, government officials, civil society organizations, activists, scholars, and researchers. As well as INGOs representatives, regional bodies, non-governmental organizations, development agencies, and youth. Engaging youth in the seminars can help foster a new generation of peace advocates and leaders who will contribute to sustainable peace and security in the region.

Expected Outcomes:

- Knowledge and Learning: Attendees of the seminars will gain valuable insights and knowledge through dialogue, presentations, and discussions. They will learn about effective peacebuilding strategies, intercultural dialogue, regional peace and security conditions, and the role of women as key actors in promoting peace, security, and democracy.
- Empowerment of Women: The seminars will provide women with the necessary tools, resources, and skills to act in their communities.
- Formation of an International Alliance: Through the seminars, participating countries, organizations, and individuals will have the opportunity to collaborate and form an international alliance for peace and democracy. This alliance will serve as a platform to promote the role of women in peace, security, and democracy. Together, we will forge a path toward a more equitable and harmonious world. The time to act is now, and the IWDPA is the conduit for change.
